## **Class News**

- Year F We have had another great week in Foundation. All the children really embraced the Bassistry workshop on Tuesday and showed the greatest rhythm and performance skills! We have been learning more about classroom routines this week and also had fun playing some playground games in PE. We have been doing some lovely maths work, especially thinking about the number 4 and how we can build this number in different ways.
- Year 1 This week in Year 1 we have been using our imagination as we have moved on to a new story in English called 'Not a Stick', we have been imagining what we would use the stick for and writing sentences about it. In maths we have been continuing to learn more about place value and we have been learning to compare numbers using the greater than, less than and equal to signs.
- Year 2 This week in maths, Year 2 have really started to master counting on and back in tens from different numbers and even made it over one hundred! In English we have started learning how to write a discussion using questions, adjectives and keeping what we want to talk about nice and organised. We cannot stop doing art at the moment and have been finding lots of opportunities to turn sound effects into colourful Pop Art as we have been enjoying this style so much.
- Year 3 Year 3 have had a busy week. On Tuesday, we learned all about Stone Age tools as part of our history topic, and we were even lucky enough to handle some real Stone Age artefacts! We then made our own Stone Age tools by carving (or 'kapping') a bar of soap. In English, we have begun writing fact files about the Stone Age and in maths we have been learning to count in steps of 50. We also earned our marble treat!
- Year 4 This week in Year 4 we have been showing off what we have learnt so far this term. In English the children amazed us with this descriptive writing, using powerful verbs and adventurous adjectives to write about an autumn scene. In maths we have just finished learning about place value, the class worked really hard during the end of unit assessment! On Tuesday we had an amazing day with The Bassistry Team! It was lovely to see all the class getting fully involved in the singing, clapping and dancing! They loved showing off their song at the end of the day in our whole school assembly!
- Year 5 Year 5 have had a busy week! In English, we have been exploring character descriptions from different texts, including our class book The Explorer. In maths, we have finished our place value unit and carried out our first assessment. We have now started looking at addition and subtraction strategies. We really enjoyed Bassistry and performing at the end of the day. I was very impressed with Year 5's rhythm!

**Year 6** Year 6 have been busy this week deepening our understanding of our text The Ways of the Wolf. We have been using the text to conduct our own research about wolves and learnt how to make effective and concise notes in order to do presentations about our findings. In maths we have been investigating different types of numbers such as prime, square and cubed and we have also begun to refresh our knowledge of multiplying using the column method. As a class we loved the Bassistry Music workshop. We loved making the different rhythms as groups and putting it all together to make some wonderful music. As scientists, we have been learning about how reflections can be used to help us see and we enjoyed seeing what happened when we shone a light at mirrors and changed the angle the light hit it.
