Dear Parents and Carers,

Latest guidelines and updates

We were hoping for better news on the easing of restrictions, but unfortunately, this has been delayed. This will effect some of the planned events at School.

We are sad to say that the Friends of Stockham BBQ and disco will not be able to go ahead as planned. There will be discussions about re-arranging this event for next academic year. It is our 50th year of Stockham School this year, so we will be planning for some lovely whole school events. The car boot sale will also not be able to take place.

Sports day – The children will still be going ahead with sports day as planned, but without the parents watching. I understand that this is disappointing for all. I have consulted with ten local primary schools, and all schools are not inviting parents onto the school grounds due to the high risk of increased social interaction. The staff will be taking lots of photos and we will share these with you after the event.

Year 6 leavers play – The Year 6 children are working very hard on their leaver's play. This will be going ahead. We are looking at the possibilities of either performing outside (weather dependent), risk assessing 2 performances inside the school hall following the 'performing arts' guidelines or recording the performance. To have parents watching in real life will be our top priority. Any decisions will be shared with Year 6 parents as soon as we can.

I am delighted to share with you all who will be teaching and supporting your child in September. There are a few changes to some of the staffing. We will sadly be saying good-bye to Annie Davis who will be moving to her cottage in Devon in the Summer holidays. Annie has been a dedicated teaching assistant at Stockham School for 16 years! We will also be wishing Miss Booton lots of luck for her next teaching position in a local school. The Year 6 class have blossomed under your caring nature, all the staff will miss having you on the team.

We will be welcoming Miss Catherine Hughes back as a Teacher at Stockham. She missed us too much and following a formal interview process, will be returning in September with her excellent experience and knowledge.

Mrs Sarah McNaught will be focusing on her play therapy training and we are pleased that she will continue to be working at the school as a cover supervisor and play therapist.

Kristal Rees will be staying with us permanently in September, supporting children in Year 3.

Class News

- **Year F** In Foundation this week we have continued with our storytelling in preparation for our class trip on Friday. We are very excited about the trip! We also worked really hard during our sports day practice, especially in the heat this week. In maths we are practicing our addition skills with numbers up to 20.
- **Year 1** Year 1 have been continuing to work on non-fiction texts, we have been talking about the right ingredients to make a great non chronological report and researching facts about blue whales. In maths we have been comparing objects and numbers and using the greater than, less than and equal to symbol.
- Year 2 We had the most amazing time on our class trip to Marwell Zoo this week. We enjoyed two educational presentations from the experts at Marwell. They taught us all about the habitats of animals and we enjoyed the opportunity to get up close to many objects. We were even able to touch some animal fur and teeth! We were very hot all day but we loved seeing the flamingos, penguins, rhinos, zebras, giraffes and so much more!
- **Year 3** In English we have been using organisational features of non-narrative material to write sets of instructions. In maths we have been using peas, dogs and pirates to help practise our 3, 4 and 8 times tables! We have also learnt how to write our name in hieroglyphics and enjoyed our prize from winning the coin collection challenge!
- Year 4 have been busy this week exploring our new book 'The Lost Thing'. We have deepened our knowledge of some of the settings and The Lost Thing itself. We have learnt to use the 'pyramid method' to write some amazing sentences and lots of us were able to add clauses into our sentences by using this method. In maths we have been learning how to order and compare decimals. We have enjoyed learning about the Wright brothers and how they used their learning powers to invent the first aeroplane and we then had a go at designing our own paper planes and even had a flying contest at the end of the lesson!
- **Year 5** Year 5 have been looking at non chronological reports in English and have been investigating Emperor penguins. In maths we have continued to deepen our knowledge of decimals.
- **Year 6** Year 6 this week have been working very hard towards their leavers performance. They have all learnt their lines and are doing an incredible job! In maths we have also been learning about horizontal and vertical reflections as well as 3D shapes and nets.
