Coronation cake design

PRIMARY SCHOOL CAKE-TOP COMPETITION

As part of the Town's Celebration of The Coronation of His Majesty The King and Her Majesty The Queen Consort, on Saturday 6th May 2023, the Market Place will be closed and a large screen to display the Coronation installed. There will be tables and chairs laid out, food and drink stalls, a stage with musical entertainment, and various children's rides and family entertainment.

As part of the celebrations, two large cakes (28" by 14" / 71 cm by 35 cm) are being baked professionally. One cake will have the Coronation logo, see below; the other will have a design created by a local primary school pupil. Stockham School will hold its own competition and submit 2 winning designs from each appropriate year group. These designs will then be judged and the overall winner's design put onto the cake. The Winner and Runners' up will be displayed in the Vale and Downland Museum and will be given Coronation related prizes and certificates.

All the children will be designing our cake toppers later this term, ready to submit them before the 20th April.

Class News

- **Year F** In Foundation this week we have enjoyed the slightly warmer weather and some spring sunshine we've spent lots of time outside! We have been looking at the lifecycle of a caterpillar, after reading the story of The Very Hungry Caterpillar. We also practiced our days of the week while retelling the story. In maths we have started learning about doubles, with some lovely links to butterflies too!
- Year 1 This week in Year 1 we have been exploring inventions that have changed the way we live, comparing what technology we have now to what people had in the past. In English, we have been preparing to write our own version of the pigeon story using lots of features of effective instructions! In science, we went on a puddle hunt to investigate how rain is a liquid in our everyday materials unit of work.
- **Year 2** Year 2 have been having lots of fun exploring the history of Wantage and some of the people that used to be found here. They really enjoyed their museum visit and their behaviour was amazing. In maths we have started measurement and in science we have been exploring the life cycle of a plant.
- Year 3 In maths we have started to learn about mass and capacity. This week we have focused on mass, learning about intervals between two numbers and what they are counting up in on scales. In English we have been back to 1922 when Howard Carter found the tomb of Tutankhamun. We have hot seated Howard Carter and Lord Carnarvon to help us write a diary entry. We are very excited to have started making our Egyptian masks. Thank you for all the cardboard you have sent in!
- **Year 4** This week Year 4 have been learning how to identify and use fronted adverbials within their writing. They are a great way for the children to start their sentences when creating their own biographies. Joining the rest of the school to celebrate Red Nose Day meant we could let our silly sides show, taking part in musical bumps and fun quiz's.
- Year 5 Year 5 have been working hard this week. We have been learning how to add different grammatical features into our writing such as dialogue, personification and complex sentences. In maths we have been learning 3 digit by 2 digit multiplication and then solving reasoning problems. We have continued to look at chemical reactions in science and are looking forward to starting our new unit on forces next week.

Year 6 Year 6 have been really busy this week preparing for our assembly. We have really enjoyed looking back over all the work we have completed since beginning Year 6. It has helped us to realise just how much we have covered already. In English we have started our new book The Last Bear. It has made us start to think about the affect people are having on our environment. We are looking forward to finding out more about how April will help the bear she has met. In maths we have started to make links between decimals, fractions and percentages.
