## Children's annual reports




#### Breakfast club increase in fees


In line with food and utilities increase in cost, we will be charging £3 for breakfast club from September 2022. This is still a lower cost for school extended day in comparison to any other schools locally.



We have been reflecting on our time together in Foundation and thinking about the things that we have treasured over the last year to go in our pirate treasure boxes. We've also been practicing hard for our sharing assembly and can't wait to share our work with you all next week.
- Year 1 Year 1 had an amazing sports day and really enjoyed showing off their different sporting talents! In English we have been reading the story Bedtime for Monster by Ed Vere. The children drew their own monsters and described them using adventurous adjectives!
