Dear Parents and Carers,

Happy New Year to you all! I do hope that you were able to have an enjoyable break. As I'm sure you will be aware, guidance for Covid-19 has changed again over the holiday. The main changes have been in self-isolation rules for society generally and mask wearing in secondary schools.

An important reminder is that you should not send your child to school with any one of the Covid-19 symptoms unless they have had a negative PCR result. The symptoms are:

□ high temperature – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)

Or

□ new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)

or

□ loss or change to your sense of smell or taste – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Anyone with symptoms should get a PCR test and isolate until they receive a negative result; this includes children.

If your child has a positive lateral flow test, they should also self-isolate and you should arrange a PCR test.

As before, please let the school know by emailing office.2583@stockham.oxon.sch.uk if your child has symptoms, a positive PCR test result or lateral flow result.

New rules on self-isolation for those who have tested positive for COVID-19

Since Wednesday 22 December, the 10 day self-isolation period for people who record a positive PCR test result for COVID-19 has been reduced to 7 days in most circumstances, unless you cannot test for any reason.

Individuals may now take lateral flow tests on day 6 and day 7 of their self-isolation period. Those who receive two negative test results are no longer required to complete 10 full days of self-isolation. The first test must be taken no earlier than day 6 of the self-isolation period and tests must be taken 24 hours apart. This also applies to children under 5, with testing at parental or guardian discretion. If both these test results are negative, and you do not have a high temperature, you may end your self-isolation after the second negative test result and children can return to school from day 8. Anyone who is unable to take lateral flow tests will need to complete the full 10 day period of self-isolation. Further information is available in the stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed COVID-19 infection.

Rules around close contacts remain the same-here is a reminder:

Those who are fully vaccinated, or pupils and young people aged between 5 and 18 and a half, who have been identified as a close contact of someone with Covid, should take a lateral flow test every day for seven days and, unless they have a positive test result or develop symptoms at any time, they should continue to attend their setting as normal. Children under the age of 5 should not do a daily test

or self-isolate and should attend their provision unless they have symptoms or receive a positive PCR test result.

Our risk assessment remains the same as before Christmas, with an emphasis on good ventilation and hygiene (washing/sanitising hands regularly and frequent cleaning of touch points). Staff continue to test twice weekly and to wear masks in all communal areas unless exempt. Once again, many thanks for your continued support with these measures.

Class News

- Year F We have loved hearing all of the children's holiday news and Christmas highlights this week. We have turned our illustrations into a class book! The children all did wonderful show and tells of their favourite toys. They are using their toys as the subject for detailed observational drawings using oil pastels and have written captions for their artwork to go on our display. In phonics we have been refreshing our knowledge of the sounds and tricky words we have learned so far, ready to move onto the next phase soon. In maths we have started to think about counting beyond 5 and how we can use our knowledge of 1-5 to help us.
- Year 1 This week in Year 1 we have been learning about subtraction. The children have been using pictures to tell a story about taking away. In English we have been looking at nouns and adjectives. The children have been using lots of adjectives to describe different items from our classroom! In phonics we have been looking at some new sounds! The children have learnt a new way to make the sounds 'ay' and 'ou'.
- Year 2 In Year 2 we began the term by writing thank you letters to Santa. We thought carefully about what a good letter needs and made sure we included all the important features. We also made thoughtful New Year's Resolutions. In maths we have been looking at fact families and in English we have been preparing to write our own song to the tune of London's Burning.
- Year 3 In English Year 3 have been recapping past tense and looking at the structure of our sentences. We have also been discussing what makes a great sentence! In maths we have been working on adding and subtracting 3 and 2 digit numbers, we have needed to use lots of perseverance when using exchanging.

 We have also started to look at our new topic of 'Ancient Egypt', we all really enjoyed talking about all of the things that we would like to learn about this topic.
- Year 4 have had a great start back to term 3 and have already been very busy! In English we have begun to learn our new story based around the story explaining the pattern on the Willow Pattern pottery. Ask us if we can remember the story at home! In maths we have begun to look at units of measurement and have been measuring and comparing the different lengths of items. In history we have begun to look at timelines again and see how many different events and time periods we can place in the correct order! We have tried to place our new historical focus of the Shang Dynasty on there as well.
- **Year 5** This week Year 5 have started looking at multiplication in maths. In English we have re-capped on last terms work before we write our own transmission. We have also listened to and appraised a freedom song in music.
- **Year 6** This week in Year 6 we have been exploring how we are connected to others. In geography, we have been exploring trade. In English, we have begun to look at features of letter writing and researched how we have an impact on children's education through affecting the climate. In reading we have been focussing on the power of words to provide hidden meaning.
