#### **Class News**

- **Year F** We have continued looking at minibeasts in Foundation, bug hunting, watching our tadpoles carefully as they start to develop legs, and thinking about how bees help us. We very much enjoyed writing instructions and making our honey sandwiches!
- Year 1 This week in Year 1 we have been writing our own stories about Cat's Bad Dream, we have also been looking at plurals ending in s and es and also suffix 'ing'. In maths we have been looking at numbers up to 50, we have been working on our counting and number recognition and also building numbers so that we know how many tens and ones they are made up of.
- Year 2 In Year 2 this week we have enjoyed finding out more about the UK and the capital cities of each of its four countries. We have become experts in using the atlas and UK map to locate each city and some of us have even looked for other towns and cities we know of. In English, we are working hard on our newspaper reports and have particularly enjoyed all our role-play work. We have loved playing characters from The Wizard of Oz and the role of newspaper reporter too.
- Year 3 This week in English we have been looking at writing compound sentences and working on improving our vocabulary. In PE we have been practising our bowling and fielding skills in cricket. We have also enjoyed sharing our homework with each other and have earned another class Marble Jar treat. Year 3 have all worked incredibly hard this term and deserve a well-earned break!
- Year 4 Year 4 have had a great final week of term We have enjoyed finding out the ending for our play Bombs and Blackberries and putting our acting skills to good use! We can now all confidently name the features of a play script and use these in our own scenes. In maths we have been exploring decimal numbers and learning about how tenths and hundredths are linked and how to write these as decimals. We have also been artists and have really enjoyed working on our bas-relief Spitfire sculptures. We really had to use our learning powers for this project but it was really worth it!
- Year 5 Year 5 have had a great week. They have been working on decimals in maths and in English they have finished writing and editing their stories. I have been really proud of the effort they have all put into their projects. They have been amazing.
- Year 6 Year 6 have had a wonderful start to the last week of term. We have been investigating some problem solving tasks, including building the tallest tower out of spaghetti and marshmallows and making a "selfie stick" for the ExoMars Rover.
