#### Class News

- Year F In Foundation class we have enjoyed meeting some real life superheroes this week and finding out about how they help people, what skills they have, and how they use their special gadgets and equipment. We have had some wonderful visits from parents, grandparents and the wider community who have volunteered their time to come and tell us about the amazing jobs they do that help other people, just like superheroes. In phonics we have learned some more new digraphs, and a TRIgraph! In maths we are learning about the number 6, and in PE we were graceful big cats climbing onto larger and more challenging pieces of gym equipment. What a busy week!
- Year 1 This week we have really enjoyed our ICT lessons. This week we have been learning how to change and edit our writing using the toolbar. We are able to change the font, size and colour of our writing. We showed excellent teamwork, used the computers respectfully and supported each other when stuck. We have also been continuing to work hard on writing descriptive sentences, and summarising our new story: Anancy and Mr Dry Bone.
- **Year 2** Year 2 have been very busy this week designing and creating their wind powered cards. They thought very hard about their joining techniques and how to improve their designs once they were tested. In English we have been writing some amazing letters and in maths we have begun exploring shape.
- **Year 3** In English this week we have been learning about poetry, with a focus on raps. We have learnt the key features of a rap and will write our own rap to perform to the class. In maths we have been learning about length. We have measured different items thinking about the best unit to measure in.
- **Year 4** Year 4 have been creating their final published copy of their fable which will become a part of our new Year 4 corridor display. We have also been scientists and conducting an experiment into tooth decay. Eggs have been left in different liquids and observed each morning to see if there are any changes. A messy but fun activity.
- Year 5 Year 5 have been working hard looking at how to spot fraction equivalence and ordering fractions. In English we have continued to write our own versions of the Highway Man Poem looking at poetic features such as repetition and rhyme. In science we have started to look at what causes rust and how we can protect against it.
- Year 6 Year 6 have been busy this week deepening our understanding of our book The Barnabus Project by becoming journalists. We have brought together all of our learning about how to write a good news report and have published our final drafts; including direct and reported quotes, formal language and pictures with captions. In maths we have started to learn about algebra this week. We have learnt how numbers can be replaced by letters and used these in simple expressions. As historians we have moved on to thinking about how The Tudors dealt with medical issues and decided that we wouldn't really have liked to have been alive then! Ask us why donkeys were used as a cure! As scientists we learnt all about our blood and what it is made up of. As artists we have learnt about the reductive technique and used it to make some great artwork.
