Class News

Year F This week in Foundation, through the story book 'Colour Monster', we have been thinking about the different emotions that we can feel. The children thought about the words happy, sad, angry, scared, loved and what they mean and can feel like. Later in the week, we thought about what feelings feel nice or not so nice and how to support the different feelings that we can get. The children have been busy in phonic lessons and have been introduced to the sounds, g, o, c and k. These sounds have also been hiding in the learning environment and we have really enjoyed hunting to find them! The children have also been busy in maths, learning how numbers 2, 3 and 4 are composed of 1s and thinking carefully about how the whole is made up of

smaller parts.

- Year 1** This week in Year 1 we have been busy learning about our 5 senses in science. This week we focused on our taste and tasted some jam, lemon curd, marmite and honey, we didn't like the marmite very much! In English we have been completing our story maps based on the colour monster story and continuing to find out about our local area and King Alfred in History.
- Year 2** Year 2 have been really enjoying learning about the Great Fire of London. This week we created Tudor style houses from Pudding Lane and listed all the reasons why they caused the fire to spread. In English we have begun recycling the story of Eliot the Midnight Hero with our own superheroes, missions and super powers. In geography, we have created fact files on the three different types of wildfire.
- Year 3** Year 3 have been busy in English this week finishing their Stone Age stories. In maths, we have continued our work on place value, focusing on placing 3-digit numbers on a number line. In history, we learned about the Skara Brae, which was once a Stone Age settlement. In music this week, we created a soundscape to accompany a short film.
- Year 4** This week in Year 4 we have been learning more about the Romans' invasion of Britain. We looked into the reasons why Britain was so appealing to the Romans, and how many attempts they had to invade! We have also been working on rounding numbers to the nearest 10 and 100.
- Year 5** Year 5 have had a very busy week. They have continued to explore place value in maths and have been writing and editing their non-chronological reports. We also had a fantastic visit to the Beacon to hear the Lauren St John talk about her book Finding Wonder. The children were all a credit to Stockham School following all of our 3 rules. Well done Year 5, we are very proud of you!
- Year 6** Year 6 have been really busy this week. We have been investigating our new text The Ways of the Wolf. We have made predictions about the type of book we think it will be and explored some of the tricky vocabulary in it. We are looking forward to learning more about wolves as we delve further into the book. In maths we have been revising methods for addition and subtraction and have reminded ourselves about common factors and multiples. As geographers we have explored some of the geographical features of North America and as scientists we have learnt about light reflection and carried out an investigation about how light reflects differently on different surfaces. We all also really enjoyed our visit to The Beacon and listening to author Lauren St John talking about her life and books.
