Class News

- Year F In Foundation this week we have started our new term theme of Growing and Changing. Inspired by the story of The Tiny Seed we have planted cress seeds and are enjoying watching them grow and change every day! We are also exploring the art of Eric Carle, the author and illustrator of The Tiny Seed, and have loved having a try at process painting to create painted papers for a collage artwork in his style.
- Year 1 This week in Year 1 we have started our new English topic based around the story Don't let the pigeon stay up late! We have been looking at how we can use imperative verbs (bossy verbs) to tell someone what to do. In maths we have been exploring how our knowledge of doubles can help us to work out 'near double' calculations. In PSHE, we have been looking at making healthy lifestyle choices.
- Year 2 This week, Year 2 have been very busy showing their teachers everything they have learnt so far this year. They have made everyone very proud with their determined attitude. In geography, we have started to explore farms and in science looked at the difference between bulbs and seeds. In English, we have started to explore nature poems.

- Year 3 We are very excited to start our new topic 'Walk like an Egyptian.' In English we have started looking at instruction writing. We have mummified a piece of fruit which will help us with our instruction writing next week. In maths we have been calculating the perimeter of a 2D shape. We have been measuring the perimeter using cm. In art we are looking at Egyptian masks. This week we focused on detail and accuracy and drew our own faces. We also experimented with different pencil shades using art pencils.
- Year 4 This week, Year 4 have been getting to grips with our new units of work including colour mixing during art lessons and discussing the importance of friendships during PSHE. On Tuesday afternoon the children joined in a Challenge Afternoon which they earnt during last term. Within their Houses they took part in classroom and sport games including some energetic games of Dodgeball. A well-deserved treat.
- Year 5 Year 5 have been working hard this week. We have started looking at the book 'Gorilla' by Anthony Browne in English and in maths we have been adding and subtracting mixed numbers. We have started looking at Anglo Saxons in history and in science we have been investigating the effects of rusting on iron.
- Year 6 Year 6 have had a busy return to school for the beginning of term 4. We have enjoyed starting our poetry unit and exploring the poems in our new book The Lost Words. We have been set a challenge to bring back some words which are becoming lost from children's vocabulary. We have started to do this by writing our own version of the poem 'Willow' about a bird of our choice. In maths we have completed our learning about algebra and done some assessments to see how much we can remember from all of our maths learning. As scientists we have been investigating the effect of exercise on our pulse and as geographers, we have started to think about what we understand by the term climate change. We were super excited this week when our pen-pal letters arrived from Canada and are looking forward to replying.
