Consultation on support for children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) in Oxfordshire

Oxfordshire are running two consultations on plans to develop a more inclusive approach to supporting children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND). These consultations are interlinked and run together between Monday 10th January and Thursday 10th March 2022. The council and its partners are seeking views on a draft Local Area SEND Strategy to develop high-quality services across education, health, and social care to support children and young people and their families. Oxfordshire County Council's proposals for system reform for SEND include making more high-quality SEND education available closer to home, reducing reliance on out of county provision, and improving educational outcomes for children through closer partnerships between the council and schools.

Class News

- Year F** In Foundation Class this week we have travelled 12,430 miles north from last week and are thinking about the Arctic, in particular polar bears, and how they manage to survive in the cold all year round. We have created some amazing chalk drawings of polar bears, written a polar bear fact file and investigated how blubber keeps Arctic animals warm.
- Year 1** In Year 1 this week we have been working on our fairytale's and traditional tale's character descriptions. The children have been using the adjectives they thought of last week to write a couple of sentences describing their characters. In geography we have been looking at different maps, comparing The United Kingdom and China. The children have been looking through a range of non-fiction texts about China to find things they would like to learn more about!
- Year 2** In Year 2 we have been sharing and grouping in our maths lessons to help us learn how to divide. In English we have been finding out all about fire engines so we can write explanation texts about them. We have made sure all the features of explanation texts are included in our writing.
- Year 3** This week in maths Year 3 have been working on multiplication, we have been using equal and unequal groups, the multiplication symbol and arrays. In English we have continued to look at our text, The Secrets of the Sun King, we have been thinking about how a diary is written and also learning what a metaphor is and how to use them to make our writing. We are really enjoying our history focus on Ancient Egypt and this week we have been exploring what inventions and achievements the Ancient Egyptians have brought to society today.
- Year 4** Year 4 have been really busy this week in English investigating how to use all the features we have learnt about a good letter, when writing our own letters in role as characters from our story. In maths we have been exploring perimeter more and have been able to find the perimeter of both rectangles and some tricky rectilinear shapes. We have loved being scientists this week while carrying out our experiment to find out which liquids have the biggest effect on our teeth- ask us about how we found this out and what our results were. We were quite surprised by some of the results! As historians we have also learnt about the gods from the Shang Dynasty.
- Year 5** Year 5 have been working hard this week. We have been looking at multiplication with Mr. Burbank and Statistics with Miss Lovegrove. In English we have been writing sentences using repetition while carefully choosing synonyms for effect. We have also started to look at maps of our local area.
- Year 6** This week Year 6 have been exploring how to use imagery to have an effect on their reader. In maths we have been exploring conversions and have begun to investigate area and perimeter. In science we have been exploring the 'national grid' and how to create wind turbines to generate electricity.
