Class News

- Year F In Foundation class this week we are getting in the halloween spirit! We have been exploring rhyming words making some silly soup in the witch's cauldron and having lots of fun with the yum/yuck rhymes in Nick Sharratt's 'What's in the Witch's Kitchen'. There is some very interesting potion making happening in our classroom 'Witch's Kitchen' as well! In maths we have been thinking about the composition of numbers: exploring how 1 and 1 is 2, and 3 can be made up of 1,1 and 1, or 2 and 1 more. Our potion making has helped us with our quantities of gruesome ingredients!
- Year 1 This week in Year 1 we have been learning lots in our science lessons. We were very lucky to have a Dental Nurse visit the class on Monday and talk to us about keeping our teeth healthy. The children have loved dressing up in PPE and role-playing trips to the dentist during their busy time. We have also been learning about senses, this week we focused on our sense of taste. The children really enjoyed trying the different foods and thinking about what category of taste they fitted into.
- Year 2 We have continued to study the Space Race in our History lessons this week and have enjoyed watching a video of the moon landing! We are looking forward to finding out more about Neil Armstrong, the first man on the moon, in our next lesson. In English we have been writing a character description about the main character from our story, The King and the Moon. We have worked hard to use adjectives and expanded noun phrases in our writing.
- Year 3 In maths this week we have been learning to count in 50's up to 1000. We have also been adding and subtracting multiples of 100. We have been revising counting in 2's, 5's and 10's. In English we have been building towards writing our own piece based on Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. We have been putting all our learning from the whole term together and using adjectives, adverbs, noun phrases, conjunctions, speech and short sentence to make our writing dramatic and interesting.

- Year 4 Year 4 have been busy this week deepening our understanding of different poetry features. We have learnt about personification, rhyme, repetition, similes and alliteration. Ask us if we can give you an example of each. We had great fun writing our own examples of these. In maths we have been deepening our understanding of rounding and have now learnt how to round to the nearest 100 and 1000. We have been scientists this week and have carried out some different experiments involving water. We even made our own mini water cycles. As geographers we have also investigated the different features of a river and learnt some key vocabulary.
- **Year 5** In English this week, Year 5 have started to plan our expedition diaries about the sinking of Shackleton's ship, The Endurance. In maths, we have continued our arithmetic topic looking at inverse calculations and rounding. We have learnt about the natural and human landmarks of Chile, with some first hand insight from Mr Le Coyte.
- **Year 6** This week, Year 6 have been exploring multiplication in maths and in English we have begun to tell stories and look at the ingredients of a fable. In science we have been organising data and in art we have begun to explore what mediums we like to use.
