Class News

- Year F** In Foundation this week we have been busy getting to know our new classroom, finding out our school routines and meeting all the adults who will be helping us. Mrs Hackwood, Wendy, Clare and Jacqui are so proud of all the children for listening carefully, being kind to each other and showing such amazing independence.
- Year 1** This week in Year 1 we have been settling in to our new classroom and getting to know the adults and the classroom expectations. We have started our mastering number sessions with a particular focus on subitising numbers to 5.
- Year 2** Year 2 have been busy settling into their new classroom. We have been focussing on using our listening skills and looking at what makes us heroes. We have decided to be the Year 2 team 'Cheetahs' and have been exploring what Cheetahs do that makes them a good team.
- Year 3** This week we have been focusing on settling back into school. We have been discussing and demonstrating how we can fill other peoples and our own bucket based on the book 'Have you filled a bucket today?' We have discussed kindness and how we will support each other in the classroom. In maths we have been looking at 2-digit numbers to 100, how numbers are represented and partitioning. We have also been developing our team ethos by playing team games and getting to know each other.

- Year 4** The first week for Year 4 has been brilliant. As a class we read the book 'The Colour Monster' and used it to explore our own emotions and those in others. Sharing our ideas about how we can encourage happiness in others and how sometimes we can feel more than one emotion at a time. In English we practiced using a thesaurus to find synonyms for our poetry. We then went on to expand our understanding of the range of emotions we can feel and created our own colour monster. In maths we began the unit of Place Value and have been learning different ways numbers can be represented and the skill of partitioning. A great first week Year 4!
- Year 5** Year 5 have had a great start back to school. We have started the term looking at growth mindset in maths and considered what we need to be successful. For example, teamwork, deep thinking and making connections. In English we have started reading the book the Explorer which links to our South America theme.
- Year 6** Year 6 have been really busy this week and have had a brilliant return to school. Everyone has worked really hard and come back with a great attitude to their work and being the eldest in school. We have loved exploring the book 'The Planet in a Pickle Jar' and have had some great discussions about what items they might put in their 'pickle jar' to preserve it for the future. We also had great fun actually making one. We all astounded all the adults in the year group with our wonderful descriptive writing based on the book too. In maths we have been exploring the skills which are important to being a good mathematician.
