Class News

Year F In Foundation class this week we have been learning about heroes who help us - we have loved our visits from a Community First Responder, a Nurse, a Physiotherapist, a Postal Worker and a Firefighter. The children showed great listening skills and asked lots of fantastic questions. They were inspired by the visits and have enjoyed talking about what they might like to do when they are older, and how their current learning will help them in their future jobs.

Year 1 This week Year 1 have been busy creating new characters, ready for when they write their own versions of the story. The children enjoyed thinking of animals and giving them a name that rhymed. There were some fantastic suggestions, Mrs Hubbard, Mrs A and Justine were very impressed by our creativity! We have also continued reading Farmer Duck, and created our very own maps of what we thought the setting might have looked like.

- Year 2** Year 2 have been spending the week exploring 2D and 3D shapes and drawing lines of symmetry. We have been looking at news reports and exploring what they look like. In PE, we have been improvising different dance moves to show the seasons.
- Year 3** This week Year 3 have been busy finishing their steampunk helmets. They are looking great! We have learnt about textures and the importance of designing first and making adaptations as we progress. In English we have been using an apostrophe for possession and writing poems. We have had an exciting week learning about measurements. We have measured different items around the classroom using the correct unit and have learnt the equivalent lengths using metres, centimetres and millimetres.
- Year 4** All of Year 4's hard work this term has paid off with an exciting last week. We have been completing our daily observations and evaluating our predictions for our science experiment into tooth decay. The class decided that their findings surprised them and will certainly continue to brush their teeth. Furthermore, based on their own designs and research the children have created their own pizzas as part of their Design and Technology lessons. I'm sure they would all agree that tasting them as part of their evaluations was the best part!
- Year 5** Year 5 have had a great week. We have been practising our dance with Mr Chadwick and enjoying forest school. We have also been investigating rusting and other irreversible reactions in science. In English we have been writing our narrative poems and in maths continuing to develop our understanding of fractions.
- Year 6** Year 6 have been busy this week completing our work on The Barnabus Project. We have been writing our own news report scripts and have really enjoyed performing these news reports in front of the class. We made sure we used good 'news reporter voices' and the people we interviewed did a great job too. In maths we have been furthering our understanding of algebra and have learnt the difference between an expression and equation. We have used this knowledge to help us to work out what the different letters in the equations are worth. As historians we have completed our learning about medicine through time by looking at the advancements in the Victorian era and then coming right up to date by looking at the NHS. As scientists we made a trip to King Alfred's and got to experience a heart dissection and look at the different parts of the circulatory system we had learnt about in class.
