Class News

- **Year F** Foundation have continued dinosaur journey, thinking about why dinosaurs are no longer around, and what it might be like if they were! In maths we have continued our money work, and enjoyed our pretend pet shop!
- Year 1 This week Year 1 have been looking at what a dictionary is, we have been practising what alphabetical order means and finding definitions of words. In maths we have been learning how to subtract, we have been using the part whole model, the bar model and jumps on a number line to help us.
- Year 2 In Year 2 we have been focusing on the characters of The Wizard of Oz this week. We have been planning and writing character descriptions using expanded noun phrases and a range of interesting adjectives. Some of us have even incorporated similes into our writing! We have enjoyed finding out about all the different types of families of the world during well-being Wednesday time. We loved telling each other all about our own families too!
- **Year 3** This week in history we have found out all about the contents of Tutankhamun's tomb. We have written descriptions of the tomb and thought about what its contents told us about the pharaoh. In maths we have been revising our 3 and 4 times tables, and we have gathered our own positive affirmations as part of Wellbeing Wednesday.
- Year 4 have been busy this week reading more of our play 'Bombs and Blackberries'. We have found out more about the different characters and the effect of the blackout. We have all really enjoyed using lots of different accents for the different characters! In maths we have been learning more about fractions and learning how to subtract them, including with fractions bigger than one whole. We have also been investigators in our history lessons and have looked at some war propaganda posters and tried to work out what message they were trying to give.
- **Year 5** Year 5 have been working hard. We have continued to look at adding and subtracting decimals in maths and we have been exploring settings in English using extracts from the Hobbit and the Graveyard book. We have started our Ancient Greek topic in history.
- **Year 6** Year 6 have been working really hard this week. We have been looking at how to find fractions of amounts in maths, using our multiplication and division skills that we recapped at the beginning of the week. In English, we have done some hot seating of the main characters in the news report we're going to write next week!
