On Thursday 1st December, we took 9 children to a Boccia tournament at Wantage school. The children were all determined to try this new sport and worked really well in their teams encouraging each other. Kai was noticed for very steady hand and great aiming skills. All the children had lots of fun and made their teachers proud.



Class News

- Year F** In Foundation this week we carried on being animal scientists and learning about nocturnal animals, particularly hedgehogs and bats. We had lots of fun representing these animals in our artwork and trying out echolocation! In maths we have been thinking about the composition of the numbers 4 and 5, using blocks in paint to make 'stampoline' patterns of all the ways the Numberblocks could make 4 or 5. With the arrival of December we've also been getting very festive in our Elves Workshop play area and sewing stockings to hang on our classroom mantelpiece.
- Year 1** This week in Year 1 we have been busy practicing our Christmas performance ready for our shows next week! We have written sentences to describe Funni from The Secret Sky Garden. In maths, we have learnt how to systematically work out number bonds and we have learnt how we can use this skill to know that we have found all of the bonds.
- Year 2** This week Year 2 have been practising using 'because' and 'when' in sentences and using sentence starters to compare. In geography, we have been revisiting some map skills and looking at a compass rose. In science, we have been exploring the stages of a human life cycle and creating posters to show off the information.
- Year 3** This week in Year 3 the children have learnt about what sources can be used to find out about the past. They've learnt about primary and secondary sources. They have now completed sewing their Stone Age Boy trousers, which are all looking really good. We have begun learning our songs for our Key Stage concert.
- Year 4** Year 4 have been exploring the life of a river including new geographical terms. This topic has been linked to our English lessons where we are creating a Chronological Report using our knowledge of compound and complex sentences. We have started to get in the festive spirit by joining in the school tradition of decorating our classroom door for Christmas and practicing our songs for the Christmas Concert.
- Year 5** Year 5 have been working hard this week writing our own Greek Myth in English. We have also been exploring multiples in maths as well as learning our songs for the Christmas concert.

Year 6 Year 6 have been really busy this week. We have been writing our final piece for this unit of work; writing an explanation text about how the Maya have influenced us in our lives today. We had to remember lots of different writing features such as clear paragraphs, technical vocabulary, grouped information and links back to the original question we were explaining. In maths we have been learning how to multiply and divide using fractions. We have learnt a couple of tricks to help us. As historians we have been learning about the city states of the Ancient Maya and had fun planning our own city states. We have also started to get excited about Christmas and have been rehearsing for our Christmas performance.
