Class News

- Year F In Foundation this week we have been designing and building traps to try and catch any stray Gingerbread Men - unfortunately we haven't caught any at school yet! We have written instructions on how to build the traps in case anyone else wants to have a try at catching them... In maths we have been playing lots of number track games and thinking about our own mental number lines. We've also been enjoying the sunshine with lots of outdoor time and water play!
- Year 1 This week in Year 1 we have been learning about what a simile is and how we can use them to compare an object or person to something else. We have come up with some similes to describe London. In maths we have been recognising and finding half of an object or shape and in DT we have completed a product outline in preparation to build a bridge from sugar cubes, taking into consideration what we have learnt about solid structures.
- Year 2 Year 2 have had a very busy week showing off everything they have learnt this year! In art we have explored the rule of thirds when creating layered pictures outside with natural objects. In English we have begun to box up and tell our jungle stories.
- Year 3 This week in maths we have continued to learn to tell the time. We have learnt to tell the time to the nearest minute using past and to the hour. In PE the children choreographed a dance to Narnia. This looked amazing! We have been learning about the features of a river in geography.
- Year 4 This week Year 4 gave a wonderful performance of their class assembly. Their confidence shone through as they shared their hard work with parents and the rest of the school. The class were excited to send their letters about animal conservation to 10 Downing Street, they have all become passionate about the animals they wrote about, and we hope to receive a reply. Over this term the children have worked very hard and are looking forward to the half term break.
- Year 5 There were lots of very tired Year 5 children on Monday as we all recovered from the field trip. It was lovely to see the children using their learning powers to take on new and different challenges. The giant swing was a firm favourite! This week we have continued to look at decimals as well as starting to write our own non chronological reports on polar bears. In science we have been investigating the earth's rotation around the sun and the different time zones around the world.
- Year 6 Year 6 have been really busy this week furthering our understanding of The Tempest. We have investigated the character of Caliban and thought about whether he is a man or monster (or a combination of the two!) We also wrote a detailed manual about how to care for him. To end the unit, we enjoyed watching an acted version to compare it to the book we had been reading. Lots of Year 6 have also been learning about how to ride a bike safely on the road and completed the cycling proficiency course. Everyone who took part listened carefully and tried really hard to put into action everything Val and Jacqui taught them. As historians we have continued learning about The Tudors and have investigated what they would have eaten and the houses they would have lived in. We are all glad it is the end of term as we have all worked so so hard this term. Well done all of Year 6!
