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

If you have been following weekly, we are now up to Summer Term Week 11. These are more problem solving based so</p>	<p>If your child would still like to do the daily Pobble365 activity these can now be found on the following website www.pobble365.com ..</p> <p>This week we are going to start thinking about how we could innovate our own version of The Lost Thing.</p>  <p>Task 1 – Think carefully about the other lost things we see in the Lost World.</p> <p>Experiment with some designs for your own lost thing which might be found there- this could be based on the Portmanteau work from last week. You could use the sheet on the website to help you organise your ideas.</p> <p>Task 2- Decide on one of your designs from task 1 to choose as your new Lost Thing and write a detailed description of it.</p> <p>Task 3 – Create a lost poster for your new Lost Thing using the template on the website.</p> <p>Task 4 – Next week we will write our own Lost Thing story. To prepare for this, please plan your own adventure for</p>	<p>Topic – inc. Science and DT This week we are going to focus on inventing our own 'contraption'.</p> <p>Task 1 – Read Wallace's letter on the website. Then begin to brainstorm some ideas for your own invention. Try to really think 'outside of the box' about the type of machine you want to invent. What is really missing in life? Maybe a machine to help you put your shoes and socks on or a new way of travelling around. Draw out some of your ideas as detailed diagrams, making sure you label them really clearly. There is a sheet on the website to guide you if you want to use it.</p> <p>Task 2- Choose one of your ideas from task 1 and make a model of it from junk modelling materials. This is the main task for this week. Have fun with this one. Try to add lots of little details to make it truly unique.</p> <p>Science – this week we are thinking about how we classify different animals.
