Dear Parents and children of Year 4,

I hope you are all well and still continuing to spend some quality time together as a family. It was lovely to catch up with lots of you again this week when making my weekly phone calls and hearing about lots of the interesting things you have been doing. It was lovely to speak to more of the children this week as well. Thank you to those of you who have given me updated contact details. If I didn't speak to you directly, then hopefully you have picked up my message and I hope to be able to catch you next Monday.

I have also enjoyed receiving lots of your messages and photos which you sent to the home learning email address. I have been so impressed with how creative lots of you are being and the new skills the children are learning. Please keep them coming- they do help to cheer me up and I am trying to upload them quickly to the website so everyone can see them. Hopefully you will have seen Mrs Burbank's message yesterday that there is now a new email address for you to send you home learning photos, videos and messages straight to me – distance.learning4@stockham.oxon.sch.uk. The added '4' in the address will ensure it will get straight to me and then I will be able to upload any photos and reply. By sending photos to this address I will take it that you give permission for the photos to be put on the school website and in the newsletter.

As we move into another week of home learning I hope you are finding a pattern which works for you as a family. From talking to lots of you this week, there was definitely a sense of parents worrying that they are not 'doing enough' or 'the right thing' and that things have been a bit trickier the longer the time goes on. As I said to many of you, please just use the activities I suggest as a guide and if your child's interests take you in a different direction then that is absolutely fine.

Maths- I will be continuing to suggest the use of the Whiterose Maths resources but there is a slight change next week as the worksheets are no longer free on their website. As a school we have a subscription so you will find the worksheets for the week attached to this Parentmail and also on the school website. You will still be able to access the videos on the Whiterose website. Next week the focus will be on multiplication and division. There are additional resources, which will complement these resources, on the BBC Bitesize website as the 2 sites are in sync from next week. If your child is finding the Year 4 activities a little tricky then you could always have a look at the Year 3 resources and work from these instead.

Please also still encourage your child to access their Times Table Rock Star account and Mathletics.

English- Please use the links below, where you will again find 5 different presentations of English tasks based around an image and a story starter. The children can continue the story, improve some 'sick' sentences, create a drawing based on the image and story and complete some grammar work linked to the image. They could also write a diary entry based on the image or even a letter imagining they were telling someone else about what is happening.
