The ball had a bell inside and the children had to listen really carefully to stop it getting past. The children all enjoyed playing this new sport and had lots of fun. We ended up coming 1st, 3rd and 4th overall. Well done everyone!



Class News

- Year F In Foundation this week we have been thinking about animals and their babies; we saw baby goats, sheep and chickens on our class trip to Farmer Gows and have had fun learning some of the different names for baby animals. We've been using our sequencing words to recount our trip to the farm and learning some new tricky words to help in our recounts.
- Year 1 This week in Year 1 we have been continuing to learn our two times table and have just started to look at the five times table. The children have really enjoyed playing our new game fizz, buzz, concentrating really hard on the number sequence so they are able to identify if the number is in the two or the five times table. In English we have been learning about plurals, the children learnt the rule of when to add 'es' or just 's'. In science we have been exploring plants and flowers, the children worked together to carefully take apart a rose to look at the different parts to the flower.
- Year 2 In Year 2 we have been working hard on using the reading skills of retrieval and inference when reading an extract from the Wizard of Oz. We are becoming experts at using what we know from our own experiences combined with what we know from the text. In maths we have been learning about position and direction and in PE we have been working on our bat and ball skills.

- Year 3 This week in English, Year 3 have been working on combining dialogue and description in our writing, we have also been using visual clues from the pictures to tell us more about what is happening in the story. In maths we have continued to look at fractions, we have been looking at equivalence, making a whole and counting in different fractions. We have also been really enjoying our Angry Bird coding in ICT and we are working on becoming decoders!
- Year 4 Year 4 have been busy this week learning about our new text type of playscripts. We have thought about what we already know about them and looked at how they are set out and their different features. We have also started to read and act out our class text of 'Bombs and Blackberries': a play set in World War 2. In maths we have continued to learn about fractions and have learnt what happens to fractions when they go above 1 whole and have started to add and subtract with them. As historians, we have learnt about VE day and watched clips of the celebrations in 1945. We have also loved starting our 'dig for victory' project look out for our potatoes and other vegetables starting to grow!
- Year 5 Year 5 have been working hard. We have been exploring where the worlds main biomes are located in geography and have started writing a reading blog in our computing lessons. In maths we have been exploring equivalent fractions and in English we have started planning our poems.
- **Year 6** Year 6 have had an extremely busy week taking part in their SATs tests. In the afternoons we have been looking at reductive techniques in art and classifying plants.
