#### **Class News**

**Year F** In Foundation this week, we have been thinking about the celebration of Diwali. The children learnt that Diwali is a celebration of light and have made their very own Diva lamps! We have also been learning about parts and whole in maths, the children know that the whole is built up from parts. We have also been thinking about capacity and experimenting with this using water, sand, cubes and leaves.

- Year 1 This week in Year 1 we have been designing our own secret sky gardens and thinking of adjectives to describe the things we might be able to see in our gardens. We have been learning about fact families in maths and using what we have learnt to check we have found them all. We are also enjoying learning our Christmas songs in preparation for our Christmas performance.
- Year 2 This week Year 2 have really enjoyed creating their own stories based on The Cat and The King. We have managed to make the reader laugh as well as use commas when writing a list. We enjoyed sharing our stories with another partner to read aloud. In geography we have been using our atlas searching skills to go on a United Kingdom scavenger hunt by finding cities, rivers and landmarks. Rehearsals have started for the Prickly Hay nativity and we are so proud to be singing the songs without needing the words!
- Year 3 have been learning about the difference between banter and bullying as part of anti-bullying week. We have also discussed what we can do if we experience bullying behaviour. In maths, we have been learning how to carry out column subtraction with an exchange. In English, we are planning a story based on an unusual pet! Year 3 used a topographical map in geography to locate hills and mountains in the U.K.
- Year 4 In Year 4 this week we have started learning about multiplication and division. The children have been looking at different arrays of counters and explaining what different number facts it shows us. In literacy we have been looking at The Locust poem, thinking about the different ways the author has described the insect. We have started looking at different animals and thinking of our own poetic ways to describe them. In computing we have been looking how to make an audio recording, the children used the computers to record their own simile and shared them with the class.
- Year 5 Year 5 have had a very busy week. We have been investigating multiples and factors in maths using arrays to explore their different structures. In English we have continued to develop our understanding of sentence structure and trying to then apply them in our writing about Theseus and the Minotaur. In science we have been finding out about Sir David Attenborough and the impact he has had.
- Year 6 Year 6 have been really busy this week deepening our understanding of our book Rain Player. We have concentrated on the final game of Pok-a-tok in the story and used this to write detailed descriptions, sentences in the passive voice and newspaper articles. As mathematicians we have begun our unit on fractions. We have been learning how to find equivalent fractions and simplify them by finding common factors. We have also been ordering and comparing them using different properties. As historians we have been learning about how large groups of the Maya people lived in the rainforest and how they used this to their advantage. In dance, our rock and roll dances are developing well and we are looking forward to presenting these next week.
