Class News

- Year F In Foundation this week we have been talking about how it's now getting dark earlier in the day and some of the festivals and celebrations from around the world that have lots of lights, lanterns and fireworks to light up the dark nights of winter. We enjoyed trick or treating the other classes in the school on Halloween, and have been learning about Diwali and made our own clay diva lamps in DT. We have also started the next phase of our phonics lessons and are enjoying learning the sounds that match the letters of the alphabet! In maths we have been thinking about more and fewer.
- Year 1 This week in Year 1 we have been learning about Guy Fawkes and why we celebrate the 5th of November. We have started looking at adjectives and how we can use our senses to describe a place. In maths we have been looking at place value of numbers up to 20.
- Year 2 Year 2 have been looking at what animals need to survive in science. In maths, we have been ordering numbers. We have had a very busy week showing our teachers what we have learnt in our assessments and using our perseverance.
- Year 3 We hope you all had a lovely half term and a spooky Halloween! We have begun our new theme in class, learning about the Stone Age period. On Monday, we learnt about Stonehenge, focusing on when and how it was built and the myths around why it was built. We have started a new narrative in English, The Stone Age Boy in which we will base our own narrative on in a couple weeks' time. In maths we have been learning to add and subtract crossing the ones and tens by exchanging. We have used the column method to help us work out the answers.
- Year 4 We are happy to be back together in the classroom after the half term break. We started a new unit of maths Addition and Subtraction, re-visiting how to add two 4-digit numbers together. We discussed as a class what is meant by impressionist art. Using Monet's Water Lilies and Japanese Bridge as our inspiration to create our own artwork.
- Year 5 Year 5 have started their new history topic this week all about Ancient Greece. In English they have read the Ancient Greek myth Theseus and the Minotaur and carried out some drama activities based on it. In maths, they have been learning about addition and subtraction strategies. Year 5 enjoyed their first DT lesson on 'Bread' this week, which involved tasting lots of different types of bread! In PE they learned how to play the sport Boccia.
- Year 6 Year 6 have been really busy this week starting our new learning about The Ancient Maya. We have had great fun learning about the ancient ball game of Pok-A-Tok and have even had a go at playing it (however we didn't use heavy rubber balls, we used balloons instead!) We have also done a fantastic job of tackling long division this week. Even though many of us ended up in the learning pit because it was quite tricky, by using our learning powers we overcame this and now many of us can use the method confidently. All the adults in Year 6 were really proud of everyone for persevering and being resilient.
