Class News

- **Year F** In Foundation this week we have been looking closely at faces each other's and our own, ready for painting a self portrait. We've also been practicing our listening skills with lots of fun games in phase 1 phonics time.
- Year 1 This week in Year 1 we have been learning about King Alfred and why he is an important person. We started our art lessons by looking at what a portrait is and having a go at drawing a self portrait. In maths we have been using a tens frame to count objects and looking at 3D shapes with Mrs Hubbard. In English we have continued our work on sentences and making sure that we are writing a complete thought.
- Year 2 Year 2 have been taking part in lots of drama this week. We used story telling to retell the story of Eliot the superhero.We also acted out the key events in the Great Fire of London. In guided reading we are really enjoying the tale of Beegu and have been thinking of questions she might ask.
- Year 3 We have continued to learn about place value in maths. We have enjoyed learning about 1, 10 or 100 more or less and are becoming good at understanding which digit changes depending on if it is 1, 10 or 100 more or less. In ICT the children really enjoyed using the chrome books learning about digital devices and what they are used for. The children are becoming more confident in logging in to the devices independently and using different programmes.
- Year 4 In maths, Year 4 have been consolidating their knowledge of Place Value. During a group activity they worked together to show how many ways they could represent a number within a place value chart, as well as their knowledge of partitioning. The class has also started creating their Roman mosaics, firstly planning their design on squared paper so that next week they can start to print using paints. Such a creative class!
- Year 5 Year 5 have been working hard looking at place value in maths. We have been exploring numbers up to a million and learning how to say them in words! In English we have continued our writing based on our class book the Explorer and in science we have been looking at the different parts of plants and how they reproduce.
- Year 6 Year 6 have been busy this week innovating their own stories in the style of our North American story, Raven. We have had to choose our own animal to be the hero of the story and think about what problem they could have tried to solve. We have had eagles, coyotes, bears and wolves all performing some great tricks! In maths we have been extending our knowledge of place value and using this to help us round integers and use negative numbers. In geography we have been exploring the different countries which make up North America and finding them on a map. Ask us if we can remember how many countries there are in North America.
