Class News

- Year F In Foundation this week we have continued our learning about The Three Little Pigs In science we investigated which materials would make a good strong house that couldn't be blown away by the Big Bad Wolf, and we also listened to an alternative version of the story before having a try at creating our own versions by changing the characters or the building materials. In phonics we have been practicing reading and writing words with adjacent consonants, and in PE we enjoyed using our ball control skills to throw balls at, and into, a target.
- **Year 1** This week in Year 1 we have been learning the key features of non-fiction texts in preparation for writing our own information page all about castles. We have been exploring famous landmarks in London and learning about why we will be celebrating the Kings coronation next week.
- **Year 2** Year 2 have started to explore sketching techniques in art. In science, they have explored micro habitats. In English, we have been creating our shape poems about animals and in maths we have started to explore division.
- Year 3 This week we have started learning about money in maths. We have converted pounds into pence and are learning to add and subtract different amounts. In English we have learnt to use metaphors, similes, and subordinating and co-ordinating conjunctions to write effective sentences. We are enjoying experimenting with different dynamic movements to the theme of Narnia in our dance lessons.
- **Year 4** Year 4 continue to enjoy their swimming lessons and are all making progress with their confidence and technique. They learnt about the differences between vertebrates and invertebrates, as well as how we can categorise different groups of vertebrates. In addition, they created a shape poem about their chosen historical hero including rhyming words and rhetorical questions.
- Year 5 Year 5 have been working hard this week preparing for our class assembly and are really looking forward to sharing it with you all. In addition we have been writing different parts of our non-fiction text in English based on Emperor penguins. We have finished the final part of our fractions unit multiplying fractions before we move onto decimal and percentages. We have been exploring space in our science and have been comparing distances of the plants from the sun and the affect this has on them.
- Year 6 Year 6 have been very busy this week revising and rehearing their learning ready for SATs in just over a week's time. In maths we have been deepening our understanding of angles. We have learnt that the internal angles in a triangle add up to 180°. We have also learnt about special types of triangles and how we can work out the angles in these. Using all of the information we know about angles we have then been able to work out some very tricky missing angles. In English we have been revising our grammar knowledge and have been applying our understanding about different sentence features. In geography we have finished our learning about climate change by thinking about the impact of climate change and also the 'green' jobs we might be able to have in the future to help protect our planet for future generations.
