Dear Parents and Carers, Feedback from Parental guestionnaires:

Thank you to all the parents and carers who took the time to answer the questions on the <u>Sex and</u> <u>Relationships</u> questionnaires. We appreciate your feedback and opinions. The questionnaire results showed that a large majority of parents would prefer to be told in a parentmail before their child learns about particular areas of the curriculum and 7 parents indicated that they would like more help around speaking to their child about sex and relationships. All other suggestions regarding important topics and further suggestions have been shared with teachers.

We also asked for your parental contribution towards our **vision day** in October. The vision day was very successful; your views were shared with staff and governors. Please see below some of the key vision, priorities and school values that we would like to explore further with you over the next 3-5 years.

- Year F In Foundation class this week we have been learning about the Jewish Festival of lights, Hannukah. We have made our own Hannukiah's, learned how to spin a dreidel and we have made lovely Star of David decorations. In phonics we have learned more new sounds and been able to use them to read and write! In maths we have been working on comparing amounts. We have also been practicing all of our songs for the Christmas Play.
- Year 1 This week in Year 1 we have been learning about adjectives. The children have been looking at the characters in Room on the Broom and using adjectives to describe them. We have also started to plan a new page in the story, thinking about a different object the witch could drop and a new animal who will find it! The children behaved beautifully during their sports session on Monday for Sports Week where they learnt how to play the Indian sport Kabaddi.
- Year 2 In Year 2 we have loved adding actions to the songs from our Christmas Nativity this week. We have been working so hard in rehearsals to make sure we put on a great show for our families. In maths we have been subtracting two-digit numbers using dienes and the number line. And in English, we have been very excited to write our own stories using The Freedom Song as our inspiration.
- Year 3 In maths this week we have been focusing on subtraction with exchanging, we have been using dienes and place value counters to help us. In English and guided reading we have continued to look at our text for the term - Stone Age boy. We have been using fronted adverbials and expanded noun phrases to describe and also onomatopoeia to make our writing more interesting. We are also really enjoying learning all of the songs for the Christmas play.
- Year 4 Year 4 have been busy this week thinking about how we could innovate our own escape stories based on our story 'Escape From Pompeii'. We have thought carefully about the different characters we could include and the different settings we could use. We are looking forward to writing our stories next week. In maths we have been learning how to add numbers including multiple exchanges and have now moved on to looking at how we can use the vertical method for subtraction as well. We have also been continuing to talk about keeping ourselves safe online and in history we have learnt about being a Roman soldier.
- Year 5 This week Year 5 have been working hard exploring prime numbers in maths. We have also been thinking about how we will write a transmission from another planet! The play is also coming along nicely; we have been singing the songs as well as acting the parts! We have enjoyed sports week as well!
- Year 6 This week, Year 6 have been exploring punctuation and different sentences types in English. We have also been trying to show a character's personality without telling the reader what it is. In maths we have been exploring decimals and recapping multiplying and dividing with them. In geography, we have looked at some statistics around climate change and some of the human processes having a negative influence on the world.
