I have tried to offer a mixture of suggestions, some of which will hopefully suit you and your child. Also, please do not underestimate the amount of learning that happens when children play. Playing is a familiar and safe environment in which children can (consciously or unconsciously) process what is happening at the moment, and should be encouraged no matter what the age of your child.
