

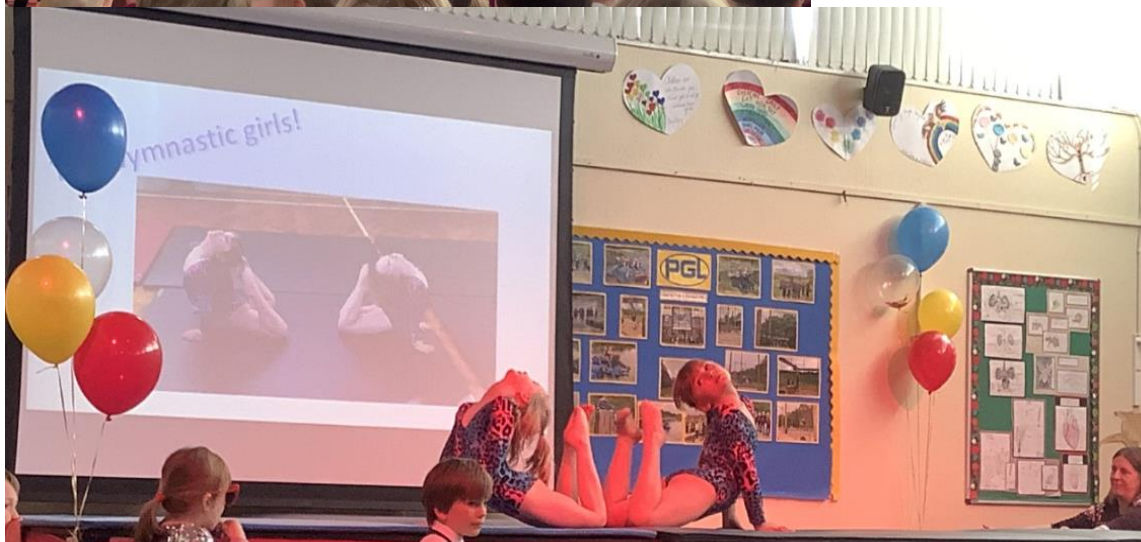

Class News

Year F In Foundation this week we have been focusing on the describing words and writing some descriptions of the characters of Jack and the Beanstalk. To help us with this we used our character movements from our PE lessons this term and acted out the story as a class. In maths we have been doing some sorting, even sorting numbers into odds and evens. It was also our class treat PJ day which was lots of fun and a super reward for all the children's hard work this term.

Year 1 This week in Year 1 we have been representing numbers to 50. The children have been using digits, words and pictures to show the different numbers, thinking about their tens and ones. In PE we have enjoyed using all the skills we have learned this term to take part in a class dodge ball game. The children had a brilliant time! In history we have been finding out a little about Queen Victoria and making comparisons between her and our current Queen, Queen Elizabeth II. The children were very surprised that children back in the Victorian times didn't have TVs or computers.

- Year 2** In Year 2 we are so excited to have earned our treat time and we had a brilliant time together celebrating our achievement. We also loved the whole school treat this week and thought the Jungle Book performance was fantastic. In maths we have been learning about tally charts and bar graphs and in English we have been writing list poems using a range of word classes to structure our sentences.
- Year 3** This week in English Year 3 have been planning and writing informal letters, we have been writing to a Year 3 class in Canada. We are very excited to see what replies we get (although we know this will take a little while as Canada is a very long way from England!) In maths we have been working on our multiplying and dividing 2-digit numbers. We have also finished off our science unit about animals including humans by looking at our skeletons and muscles. What a great term we have had in **Year 3!**
- Year 4** Year 4 have been really busy this week completing our work on our text The Lion and The Unicorn. We thought about what might have happened to Lenny after our story finished and have written the next chapter imagining what he could have got up to in Wales. In maths we have been investigating area and learning how to measure it using squares. As historians we have been learning about The Blitz and writing newspaper reports. As artists we have made links with our history learning and created stunning silhouette artwork of London during The Blitz.
- Year 5** Year 5 have been consolidating their knowledge of division in maths and we have been writing our persuasive letters in English based on child labour and fair trade. In history we have looked at different artifacts and thought about what they can tell us about Anglo Saxon life and culture.
- Year 6** In Year 6, we have been finishing our fractions lessons in maths. In English we have been comparing and contrasting different historical eras. In science we have been learning about how to keep our hearts healthy.
