Class News

- Year F In Foundation we have been learning about the lifecycle of a seed there has been lots of discussion, some planting of seeds and talking about and labelling the parts of a plant. We really enjoyed the story of 'The Tiny Seed' and were inspired by the illustrations to make our own flower pictures in the style of Eric Carle using painted papers in a collage. In maths we have been using our counting skills to count larger quantities.
- Year 1 This week we had an amazing visit from Ridgeway Bees. The children loved finding out about how Amy looks after her honeybees. They enjoyed exploring the hive, trying on the beekeeping outfits and tasting the different types of honey. In English we had been learning a poem by Julia Donaldson. The children worked in teams to each learn a stanza and perform it to the class. They all did really well!!
- Year 2 In Year 2 we are so excited to have begun our new Theme 'Follow the Yellow Brick Road'! We have already read an extract from the Wizard of Oz and we worked hard on two reading skills vocabulary and visualising. In maths, we are now learning about 2D shapes and have been counting their sides and vertices to find out if there are any patterns we notice or any generalisations we can make.
- Year 3 This week Year 3 have started to look at our new text for the term 'Hello Lighthouse.' We have been using expanded noun phrases, personification and planning an informal letter. In maths we have been learning about fractions, we have recapped learning on equal parts, finding a half and finding a quarter. Group A have also thoroughly enjoyed their first forest school session.
- Year 4 have been really busy this week and very excited (also quite tired!!). We started our intensive swimming lessons this week and have enjoyed going every day! There has been lots of use of our Learning Powers, as some of us had to face our fears as well as persevering and building on our skills each day. There have been some real moments of bravery and all the adults are so proud of all the children. We can't wait for next week! As well as doing lots of swimming, in maths we have started to learn about fractions and how these are represented. As historians we have also been learning about the different shelters they used during World War 2.
- **Year 5** Year 5 have had a great start to the summer term. We have started looking at the poem Maleficence in English and fractions in maths. We have also started looking at biomes in geography and started thinking about blogging in computing.
- **Year 6** This week Year 6 have been very busy revising for their assessments. In PSHCE we have been exploring how to look after ourselves and manage our emotions. In art we have been looking at reductive drawings.
