Class News

- Year F In Foundation Class this week we have been reading the story of Little Red Riding Hood. We have been thinking about the characters and how to describe them and used this information to create a Wanted poster for the Big Bad Wolf. We've also been using our knowledge and understanding of materials to help us make strong baskets and waterproof capes for Little Red Riding Hood. We even used our science skills to help us predict and test the materials. In maths we've been using our number staircase to help us compare the numbers and think about more than and fewer/less than.
- Year 1 This week in Year 1 we have been doing lots of research about Queen Elizabeth. The children have enjoyed looking through the different non-fiction texts to help them find facts for their non-chronological reports. In computing we have been looking at how to use the repeat button to create a shorter piece of code. In maths we have been subtracting numbers, looking at different amounts and crossing out the pictures to help us show the subtraction.
- Year 2 In our geography lessons we have begun to use maps and atlases to help us locate London and understand where London is in relation to other capital cities in the UK. We have enjoyed creating our own magical or mythical creatures in our English lessons and we are excited to report reports about them. We have worked particularly hard on organising our writing into paragraphs.

- Year 3 This week, in English, Year 3 have been following sets of instructions and thinking of all the grammatical features in these. We have also been looking at how to write an effective hook to begin our instructions. In maths we have returned to looking at multiplication and have been focusing on the 4 times table, we have been looking at the relationship between multiplication and division. We are also very excited for Red Nose Day this week and we can't wait to dress up as our favourite superhero for the day.
- Year 4 Year 4 have been busy this week deepening our understanding of our book 'The Lion and the Unicorn'. We have looked carefully at some of the main characters in the story, thinking about what we actually know about them and what we can infer. We have also learnt how to write a detailed character description by using the skills of 'show not tell'. In maths we have been learning how to multiply three digit numbers by 1 digit numbers, using the compact method. We have realised how important it is for us to know our times tables!!! As historians we have looked at the different armed forces and thought about the uniform the soldiers would have had in World War 2. We have also looked at some different sources of information about the past.
- Year 5 Year 5 have had a great week. We have been looking at persuasion in English and division in maths. We also had a great Anglo Saxon Day. We learnt all about Runes, Anglo Saxon games and battle formations!
- Year 6 This week Year 6 have begun to explore fractions in maths. In English we have been creating heart explanations through drama before we begin to write them. In science we have been lucky enough to have a teacher from KAs help us explore the heart in lots of detail by dissecting one!
