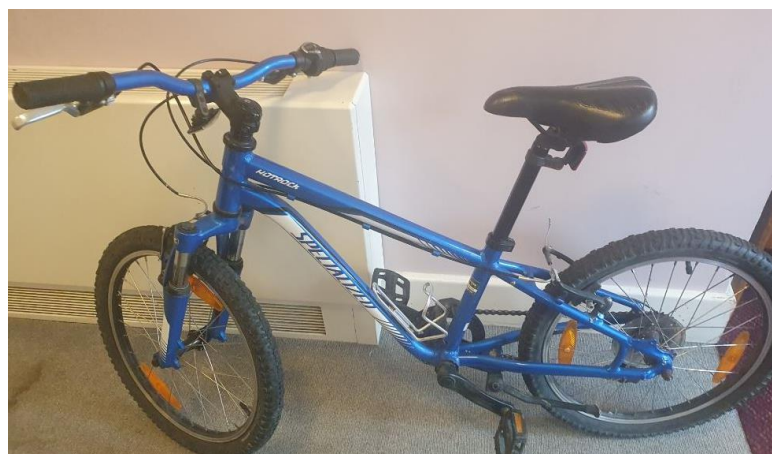
Year 2 had a fantastic morning on Wednesday, led by Science Oxford, finding out more about the Great Fire of London. The children learnt about the science behind the spreading of the fire and were very impressed to have real fire in the hall!



We were also very excited to welcome the Fire Fighters to Stockham School. Years Foundation and Year 2 spent time finding out about the role of the firefighters and how the engine is used to extinguish fires, including special clothing and equipment. They even got to sit inside the fire engine, see the blue lights in action and hear the siren.

Class News

- Year F** What an exciting start to the term we have had in Foundation this week! We began our new theme 'Light and Dark', where we will be thinking about different festivals, nocturnal animals and people who work at night. We welcomed Wantage firefighting crew on Wednesday and the children had a fabulous time learning a bit more about what their job involves. The children also got to sit in the fire truck, hear the siren and see the lights - a big thank you to Wantage Firefighters for taking time out of their busy schedule to come and visit us! We have also been thinking about the different activities that happen during the day and at night and we had lots of fun wearing our pyjamas to school on Friday!
- Year 1** This week in Year 1 we have been busy learning how to make our sentences more interesting by using adjectives to describe nouns. We have been looking at the part-whole model in maths and learning how to work out the whole number of 2 parts. In history we have been learning about Guy Fawkes and finding out why we celebrate bonfire night.
- Year 2** Year 2 were very lucky to have two workshops this week. We enjoyed our music workshop with Lin Marsh singing songs about the rain and our favourite teddy. We then had an explosive workshop with Science Oxford all about the Great Fire of London. This was a great chance for us to share all the facts we had remembered from Term 1. In English we have begun reading a funny new chapter book called The Cat and the King and have started using royal adjectives in our writing such as: majestic, regal, grand and decadent.
- Year 3** Year 3 have been studying a music video in English, which tells a story of a missing pet. In maths, we have been working on addition and subtraction strategies. In Guided Reading, we have been reading some poems - one of which was a bit of a tongue twister! We have also begun our new geography topic all about the U.K.
- Year 4** This week Year 4 have been busy! We have been learning about states of matter; how water can change from a solid, to a liquid and gas. In geography we have looked at how rivers are formed and took a closer look at the River Thames. We have started a new topic in English, we are listening to poetry and exploring similes and metaphors.
- Year 5** Year 5 have had a busy week back! We had a fantastic visit from Lin Marsh who taught the class about soundscapes using two songs - one about the rainforest as well as a spooky Halloween song! We have also started our new history topic and started learning about the Ancient Greeks. In maths, we have finished our addition and subtraction unit and will be moving onto multiplication and division. We have started to explore the difference between a myth and a legend in English.

Year 6 Year 6 have been very busy this week beginning our new learning journey about the Ancient Maya. We have enjoyed learning about the Ancient Maya game of Pok-a-tok and were very brave when most of the class said they would be willing to play it! We have all enjoyed learning our new story of Rain Player using the story telling technique and most of us can now re-tell the story from memory. In maths we have done an excellent job of learning how to do long division. All the adults in the class have been really impressed with how quickly and confidently you learnt the method. As historians we have begun to learn when and where the Ancient Maya civilisation lived and we have explored some artefacts from that time and had great discussions about what they might tell us about the people of the Ancient Maya.
