#### **Class News**

- **Year F** In Foundation this week we have been retelling the story of the Three Little Pigs, using story maps and adapting the story to put in our own twist. We learned about predicting in science and tested materials to see if they would withstand the huffing and puffing of the Big Bad Wolf. We're also thinking about alternative materials for the three houses, with some very silly suggestions to try! In maths we're focusing on careful counting again, looking at 1 more using the 'number staircase', and continuing to think about the composition of numbers to 7.
- Year 1 In Year 1 this week we have been looking at non-chronological reports. The children have been identifying the key features of the reports ready to help them create their own in a couple of weeks. During history we have been comparing photos of Buckingham Palace and Windsor Castle. The children have been looking for clues in each picture to tell them if the photo is old or modern.
- Year 2 In Year 2 we have been using all our expertise of fractions to now find the fractions of numbers. We have enjoyed drawing pictures of cakes and making bar model images to support us with this. In English we have been planning and writing non-chronological reports about dragons. We have worked hard to use interesting vocabulary and to organise our work into paragraphs.
- Year 3 This week Year 3 have been looking at our text for English 'My Strong Mind.' We are going to be writing instructions for how to be resilient, so we have been deciding what a good 'recipe' for instruction writing is. In maths we have continued to look at column addition and subtraction, we have been moving towards being able to just use the formal written method. Lots of the class have shown great confidence and determination and taken part in auditions for Stockham's got talent, it was lovely to see so many people taking part!
- Year 4 Year 4 have been busy this week finding out more about Lenny in our book The Lion and the Unicorn. We have thought about how he might have felt when he was evacuated to the country and written descriptions about the contrasting location he now finds himself in. In maths we have been investigating factors and how we can find these for different numbers. We have also begun to learn the compact method for multiplication. In history we have learnt about when and why World War II started, the countries involved and tried to order a timeline of the main events from the war. As scientists we have begun to think about sound.
- **Year 5** This week Year 5 have begun writing a persuasive letter in English. In maths we have been learning to measure the perimeter of shapes accurately. We have also started our DT topic all about bread! Year 5 have also been learning how to give directions as part of their French lesson.
- **Year 6** This week Year 6 have been exploring explanation texts. In maths, we have moved on to co-ordinates and plotting and translating shapes. In science, we have looked at the lungs role in the circulatory system.
