#### **Class News**

- Year F In Foundation this week we have continued exploring all things China and were fascinated by Mrs Lisi's talk about her visits to China. We have also been excited by the Winter Olympics currently being held in Beijing. We have thought about why there are different sports in the summer and winter Olympics, and what we might need to wear in the cold weather. We watched some of the opening ceremony and talked about teamwork, practice and persistence. The children spotted the Olympic Rings in the ceremony and we talked about these as a symbol of cooperation and how they represent the continents that take part. We have made our own Olympic rings as a class as a collaborative art project. We have watched some of the sporting events and used describing words to say what we could see and how it would feel to take part in that sport. We're writing a class poem with all of these fantastic describing words inspired by the Olympics.
- Year 1 In Year 1 this week, we have been enjoying learning a little more about China. The children loved listening to their visitor on Monday and seeing the different pictures she had taken during her time travelling around the country. In geography we have been looking at different types of maps, the children have enjoyed exploring the atlases, globes and satellite pictures. We have had a lovely week in continuous provision as well, the children have been really inspired by our geography and have spent lots of time building models of the Great Wall or of different cities in China. Some children have been busy writing their own non-fiction texts on China! In maths we have been practicing our adding but counting on using different resources to help us.
- Year 2 In Year 2 we have really enjoyed finding out about the Winter Olympics! We have learnt a little about its history, the sports that are played during the event and we have even watched videos of some competitions taking place. In maths we have begun looking at fractions and have loved cutting shapes into equal parts.
- Year 3 In maths this week, Year 3 have been looking at multiplying by 3. We have been thinking about the relationship between multiplication and division. In English we have been putting all of our ideas together from the term and writing our own diary entries about The Secrets of the Sun King. We are also having an Ancient Egyptian art day at the end of the week where we will be baking bread, making cartouches and creating clay pots.
- Year 4 have been really busy this week and super excited to get our letters written to our favourite authors, sportspeople and other people who inspire us. From Rob Biddolph and J.K Rowling to Stephen Mulhern and Katie Ormerod (and even Her Majesty, The Queen!!!) our letters will be making their way to their recipients this week. We all have our fingers crossed that some of us will get a reply! In maths we have begun really focusing on learning our times tables and have started this week with the 3 and 6 times tables. In history we have investigated how the people of the Shang Dynasty interpreted oracle bones in order to answer important questions.
- **Year 5** This week we have been writing our stories based on the Nowhere Emporium in English. In maths we have been looking at long multiplication. We have also been producing sketch maps of our local area.
- **Year 6** In Year 6 we have been exploring different map types and how they may be useful in certain situations. We have been exploring the history of the Winter Olympics and looking at chronology. In English we have been writing our stories.
