CLASS NEWS

- **Year F** In Foundation this week we have been reading "We're Going on a Bear Hunt", practicing retelling the story through puppets, acting it out and making maps to lead us to the bear. In maths we have been looking at numbers to 10 and starting to think about capacity in our practical activities.
- Year 1 In English this week Year 1 have been looking at different versions of the fairy tale Little Red Riding Hood, we have been writing about which one is our favourite. In maths we have been learning to add by using the part part whole model and counting on.
- **Year 2** This week in Year 2 we have been continuing to look at the story of The Freedom Bird, we have been creating our own freeze frames then writing sentences using the past tense and writing poems. In maths we have been learning how to subtract a single digit number from a two digit number.
- **Year 3** In English we have been planning and writing our autobiographies, and in maths we have been using the expanded method to subtract 2 and 3 digit numbers. We have been learning numbers in French and working on improving our stamina in PE.
- Year 4 have been busy this week writing setting descriptions based on our book Escape From Pompeii. We watched an animation of what might have happened when Mount Vesuvius erupted and then wrote detailed descriptions. We have learnt to build up wonderful sentences by using the pyramid method starting with a single word and ending with a full, detailed description of a particular thing. In maths we have been learning how to set subtraction out vertically and have begun to think about how to use exchange to work out some harder examples. We have also been historians and learnt all about the powerful character of Boudicca.
- **Year 5** Year 5 have been looking at Statistics in maths as well as continuing to recap on subtraction and addition methods. In English we have been looking at descriptive writing techniques as well as looking at an extract from Great expectations!
- **Year 6** This week in Year 6 we have started to look at data in maths. In English we are exploring descriptions. In geography we have been researching the effects people are having on the environment.
