Secondary School Admissions

The online admissions procedure for children in Year 6 who will be moving to secondary school in September 2025 will open on 1st September 2024. The deadline for applications to be made is 31st October 2024. You need to apply using the online form which can be found on the Oxfordshire County Council website.

You will receive a notification by email that your application has been received. You can make changes to your application, including the preferences, up until midnight on the closing date of 31st October 2024. If you return to your application at any time, to make changes, or even to simply view it, you must remember to complete the process and re-submit the application.

Any un-submitted applications will not be considered.



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Key dates for applications

- ✓ You must submit your application no later than midnight on the 31st October 2024. This is the national closing date.
- ✓ Offer emails will be sent out on the 1st March 2025.
- ✓ You must accept or refuse the place offered by the 15th of March 2025. (You will be sent instructions on how to accept your place in your offer email).
- ✓ Once you have accepted your child's place the school will contact you with further information.

Primary School Admissions

Parents of infant school children born between 1 September 2020 and 31 August 2021 need to apply for an infant or primary school place for September 2025.

- √ 4th November 2024 Applications open.

 (Applications submitted after the deadline will be processed later in the year and have a far lower chance of securing a place at a preferred school, so please apply on time)
- ✓ 29th January 2025 -Last date for confirmation of change of address.
- ✓ 16th April 2025 National Offer Day: offer letters sent by second-class post where needed and emails sent to those who applied online.
- √ 30th April 2025 Closing date for late or amended applications
- ✓ Closing date to respond to offers made on 16 April and to join continued interests list.
- ✓ September 2025- Start of the school year.

P.E

Participation in P.E is hugely important for the development of health, fitness, and wider skills for learning such as resilience and collaboration. Please check your child's P.E. kit that all clothing and shoes still fit. P.E sessions are still being practiced outside so a dark pair of jogging bottoms and a sweatshirt can also be included for comfort. Please label all uniform and P.E kits with your child's name. This way we can ensure that missing uniform finds its way back to the correct owner.

Drinks

Just a reminder that **only** still water should be sent into school in plastic bottles please. Juice, sparkling or flavoured water should not be sent in. Your support is appreciated. Research shows that drinking water throughout the day helps children to work at their optimum level.



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Healthy Break Time Snacks

Healthy snacks help manage children's hunger and boost nutrition. Snacks can keep them from getting so hungry that they get cranky. Snacks may help prevent overeating at meals. And for picky eaters of all ages, snacks are a chance to add more nutrients to their diets. Children in KS2 are not provided with fresh fruit and vegetables through the National Fruit Scheme. Unlocking the learning at home....

Help your child prepare for their learning:

Spellings – Spellings will focus specifically on the year group objectives 'Common Exception' words. Try the Spooky Spellings game to support the learning. https://ictgames.com/mobilePage/spookySpellings/index.html

Times Tables - It has been great to see the children logging in again to Times table Rockstars (well done to the children that also went on it over the summer holidays too!). Spending 15 minutes a week practising times tables is part of every year group's homework to either improve or maintain their speed and accuracy. Children must know ALL their tables by the end of Year 4 so any chance to recite them with your child is great. We will be working on all tables across all year groups. Not just 3x4 but 4x3 and 12÷4=3. We will be practising these using songs and practical activities.

The children in Year 4 will be participating in the Government's Multiplication Screening Check this during the summer term 25. The purpose of the check is to determine whether your child can fluently recall their times tables up to 12, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It is an on-screen check consisting of 25 times table questions
