Class News

- **Year F** As part of our topic 'Light and Dark', in Foundation this week we have started to learn about nocturnal and diurnal animals. We got to know the story 'Owl Babies', we then had a go at building our own story maps and pictures of the story. On Thursday, we also had a very fun visit from Oxfordshire Badger Group! We learnt lots about badgers, their habitat and what they get up to and when! A big thank you to Oxfordshire Badger Group members for taking the time out to come and visit us!
- **Year 1** This week in Year 1 we enjoyed our second forest school session where we chopped vegetables, played on the hammock and toasted marshmallows. We have started looking at how we can use adjectives to create a character description and in maths we have been learning how to systematically use number bonds.

- Year 2 This week Year 2 have been very excited about rehearsing the nativity on the stage. In DT we have been making paper looms with very colourful designs and patterns. In science we have been matching off-spring to adult animals and thinking about what happens in the brain to make humans find baby animals cute. We enjoyed our class story The Cat and the King so much that we have now started the next story in the series: Nice Work for the Cat and the King.
- Year 3 Year 3 have been learning about addition and subtraction in maths; working in columns. In English, we have been writing book recommendations for Wantage Library. They will hopefully be displayed in the library after Christmas. We have enjoyed beginning to create a cityscape in art based on the work of Charles Fazzino. We have also begun learning our Christmas songs from the film 'Polar Express' for our KS2 show 'Christmas at the Movies.'
- **Year 4** In Year 4 this week, the children enjoyed taking part in a science experiment. They spent the afternoon exploring the different ways sound travels through solids, liquids and gases. In maths we have been looking at multiples, the children have been spotting patterns in the different times tables. We have also been very excited to start rehearsals for our Christmas show!
- Year 5 have had a very busy week! They have continued to explore prime numbers, cube numbers as well as dividing and multiplying by 10,100 and 1000 in maths. The children have been reasoning and trying to spot patterns and links to other areas of maths. In English the children have continued to write about Theseus and the Minotaur and are now starting to innovate before writing their own Myth. In science we have produced posters about Sir David Attenborough considering the impact he has had and presented these to the class.
- Year 6 Year 6 have been really busy this week deepening our knowledge of the Ancient Maya in both our English and history lessons. We have been carrying out research to help us write an explanation text next week entitled 'What did the Maya do for us?' We have learnt about all the different things we have today which have been influenced by the Maya such as chocolate, calendars and even the number zero. In maths we have been deepening our knowledge of fractions and have been adding and subtracting them even when they have different denominators. In science we have been investigating how different plants are adapted to where they grow and in PE we completed our rock and roll dances. We have also been very festive and been singing our songs ready for the Key Stage 2 Christmas performance.
