Class News

Year F In Foundation this week we have been learning how to look after our new pet dinosaurs, including finding out about what they eat and the differences between carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. We talked about how humans need a varied diet and filled in a lovely rainbow of all the colours of fruit and vegetables we like to eat. We've also been learning about money in maths, and enjoyed playing shopkeepers!

- Year 1 In English we have been learning about singular and plural words, we have also been writing our own rhyming poem about pirates.
 In maths we have been practising our addition by counting to ten first. We have also really enjoyed making pirate hand prints too this week and we are very proud of how well they have turned out.
- Year 2 In Year 2 we are continuing to read our extended story The Wizard of Oz. We have enjoyed discussing the main events and the main characters. We have been looking for ways in which the characters change over time as certain events take place. In maths, we have been studying the properties of 3D shapes and we have become experts at counting their faces, edges and vertices.
- Year 3 This week in English we have been planning and writing our own diary entries inspired by Howard Carter's diary from 1922. In maths we have been adding and subtracting fractions with the same denominator, as well as investigating equivalent fractions. In French we have been learning how to say some common classroom instructions.
- Year 4 Year 4 have been very busy this week learning more about the play we are investigating Bombs and Blackberries. We have enjoyed acting out the next scene and thinking a bit more about the characters we have met and how they might have felt about being evacuated. We have also learnt more about The Blitz and the different types of shelters people would have used. We have also created stunning pieces of silhouette artwork based on The Blitz. In maths we have continued to learn about fractions and have begun to learn about how they can be added together.
- Year 5 Year 5 have been working hard this week. We have been looking at decimals in maths and recapping on adding and subtracting within 1 using both formal and informal methods. We have also been exploring show not tell strategies and have used these to describe Grendel in our writing.
- Year 6 This week has been really exciting in Year 6 as we have been talking about our upcoming PGL Trip and the activities that we would like to do. We have been learning about democracies and how we can use this in our classroom to decide upon different things. We have also been solving some really tricky fractions problems using everything we have learnt so far! The majority of the Year 6's have also been doing cycling proficiency this week and I've had some really positive feedback about everyone taking part. Well done Year 6!
