Class News

- Year F In Foundation class this week we have been focusing on the story of The Gingerbread Man. The children agreed they would want to catch the Gingerbread Man as well, because gingerbread is super tasty! We decided to make our own gingerbread men for snack - we looked up a recipe in a cook book, wrote down the ingredients we needed to buy and went to Sainsbury's to buy them. Back at school we made the gingerbread men and enjoyed eating them for snack!!
- Year 1 This week in Year 1 we have been busy writing up a recount of our school trip to the castle ready to display. We have been learning about what makes us incredible in our PSHE lessons and discussing with our classmates what makes them incredible. We have created our own mini models of the famous landmarks in London this week in teams as a challenge. It was a bit tricky, but we managed it using all our learning powers.
- Year 2 Year 2 have been busy finding fractions of different amounts in maths. In English, we have been exploring sentence types and using inverted commas (speech marks). In georgraphy, we were detectives and found out about mangrove forests.
- Year 3 I would like to thank you for coming to our assembly this week and supporting the children in Year 3. We hope you enjoyed it! They were really confident and said their words loud and clearly. This week in English we have started thinking of climate change. We will be thinking about what we can do to help our local area. We will be writing a letter to our local MP to inform him of our ideas. In maths we have been learning to tell the time on a Roman Numeral clock.
- Year 4 This week Year 4 have completed their persuasive letters to Rishi Sunak. They took great care over them and enjoyed learning about the animals which are in danger of becoming extinct. On Thursday the class spent the day on a project to design and create an Anglo-Saxon money bag. They learnt about how fabrics have changed over time and different types of stitches.
- Year 5 Year 5 have had a great week. We have been looking at decimals and percentage in maths and continuing to write a non-chronological report. We have been learning about the Richter scale and earthquakes. We are really enjoying our field trip!
- Year 6 Year 6 have been really busy this week learning about our new text The Tempest. We have enjoyed exploring some of the new language connected to the story and thinking about the motives behind Prospero's actions. We have discovered we are very good at writing our own spells to conjure a tempest of our own! In history we have been learning lots about The Tudors and investigated the kings and queens of the Tudor period and what life was like for both the rich and poor at the time. We have started to make some good comparisons and been able to place different periods and events in history on timelines around The Tudors.
