#### **Class News**

- Year F In Foundation this week we had a big surprise! A dinosaur laid eggs in our garden! We looked after the eggs until they hatched and now we are learning about the dinosaurs so that we can take care of the babies. We have been using lots of nonfiction books to learn more about the dinosaurs.
- Year 1 Year 1 have been working on adding by counting on, we have been making up our own addition number stories to go with our number sentences. In English we have been writing our own pirate song using adjectives and verbs.
- **Year 2** We are already immersed in our new class topic Follow the Yellow Brick Road! We have enjoyed the first two chapters of The Wizard of Oz in our English lessons and have made predictions about the events that may follow. In maths we have been studying the properties of 2D shapes and finding out which ones are polygons and which ones have lines of symmetry. We have discovered some interesting links and patterns!
- Year 3 have had a fantastic start to the term! We have been brilliant at investigating tenths in maths, and we have been working on improving 'sick' sentences in English. In history we have started our new topic 'What Happened to the Boy Behind the Golden Mask?' by finding out about Howard Carter's discovery of the tomb of Tutankhamun.
- Year 4 Year 4 have had a really good return to school this week. We have started to investigate our new text 'Bombs and Blackberries' which we have found out is a playscript. We have begun to learn all about the features of a playscript and are looking forward to reading it. In maths we have been investigating equivalent fractions and how we can work out if different fractions are equivalent or not. We have been historians this week as well and have begun to learn about The Blitz and what it might have been like to have lived through it. Our classroom looks beautiful as well with all the hanging weavings you created as well. A great start back, Year 4.

- Year 5 Year 5 have had a great start to the new term. They have settled in well and we had a very exciting Tuesday morning, where we had a virtual visit from the Houses of Parliment and got to ask our local MP David Johnstone some tricky questions. In maths we have been recapping on multiplying and dividing by 10,100, 1000 as well as looking at decimals. In English we have designed our own monsters who we will need to trap and overcome in our stories that we will be writing!
- Year 6 In Year 6, we have settled back into school really well. We have learnt how to divide fractions, and we are working up to writing a newspaper report about a Lighthouse in English. We even had our own Task Master competition in school and had so much fun making paper aeroplanes, building the tallest towers, and drawing upside down portraits of ourselves! A fantastic start to the Summer term!
