### **Class News**

- Year F** In Foundation this week we have been having fun exploring our local area - virtually! The children have loved exploring google maps and street view, recognising places around us and talking about the places that they know and visit. We also explored a world map and a globe in our geography lesson this week, looking carefully at the details. In maths we have been practicing our counting skills and learned how to be very careful when we count - saying one number for each item being counted, saying the numbers in the right order, and stopping when we get to the end.
- Year 1** This week Year 1 have been continuing our work with sentences and learning about what a noun is. In maths we have been comparing objects and numbers using greater than, less than and equal to. We learnt about what a human feature is in geography and spoke about what we have seen in Wantage that has been made by humans.
- Year 2** Year 2 have been exploring how to make different patterns and textures in art. In English, we have written character descriptions. We were very lucky to have the firefighters visit us to teach us how to stay safe and show us around the fire engine.
- Year 3** In English we have started researching information about Oxford to prepare us to write a holiday brochure. In art we have been experimenting with different pencil tones. We have learnt how to shade, hatch and cross hatch. The children have drawn some amazing pictures of a famous building in Oxford. We have been focusing on adding 1s and crossing the tens in maths. We have used numicon, number lines and partitioning methods to help us.
- Year 4** This week Year 4 have started to explore the features of a newspaper during English lessons. They have all shown great understanding of chronological order and can recall facts about the eruption of Mount Vesuvius. The class enjoyed creating their Christmas Cards and although a little early we could not resist listening to a few Christmas songs. Together we are learning more about the Romans, particularly Hadrian's Wall, which we now know took 6 years to build!

- Year 5** This week Year 5 have been working hard looking at place value in maths as well as writing action sequences in English! In science we have been looking at the life cycle of mammals as well as continuing to explore our geography theme based on South America.
- Year 6** Year 6 have been really busy this week deepening our understanding of our book The Ways of the Wolf. We have learnt about how to take careful and useful notes from our text, turning these into succinct note cards ready for us to present our information to the class. We all did a really good job of presenting our information. In maths we have investigated prime, square and cube numbers and have begun to work on efficient multiplication methods. As geographers we have researched and learnt about different geographical features of North America.
