Class News

Year F In Foundation this week we have been focusing on the story of Little Red Riding Hood. We wrote lists of what we thought she would have in her basket and also thought about the characters in the story and the choices they make, we even dressed up and took on the character roles to answer questions! In maths, we have been thinking about the number six and the different ways we can build this number. In PE, we carried on developing our throwing and catching skills in athletics and thought carefully about how to aim.

<u>Year 1</u> This week in Year 1, we have been learning about an array in Maths and how it can help us to count and add numbers together. In Science we learnt about the different parts of a plant and a tree and went on a hunt around the school grounds to see what plants and trees we could find! In art we have had a go at sketching in the style of Georgia O'Keeffe.

Year 2 Year 2 are becoming quite the experts on endangered and extinct animals. In English, we have been writing our own version of The Journey Home with different animals. The children have been able to use words such as deforestation, territory and climate change in their sentences as well as use the apostrophe to show that a habitat belongs to each animal. In Geography we have been researching and acting as tour guides for mangrove jungles. In PE we have been building up our skills in rounders from bowling under arm to making sure we keep running through the bases during our turn to bat. In Maths, we have been linking our knowledge of parts and wholes to creating fractions.

Year 3 have continued their work on fractions in Maths this week and have learnt what a numerator and denominator are as well as unit and non-unit fractions. In English, we enjoyed learning about the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb, and we will become newspaper reporters next week reporting on this story! Year 3 practised their jumping skills in P.E this week and learned how to improve the distance they jump. In Science, they have set up an experiment to investigate different factors on plant growth - we will keep you posted!

<u>Year 4</u> This week in Year Four the children have enjoyed their second week of swimming. They particularly enjoyed the survival swimming session where they wore their pyjamas! In our second drumming lesson, the children experimented with creating a high and low pitch by hitting the drum in different places. They also created a piece of music by splitting into two groups, each group played a different beat at the same time which added texture to the piece. In English the children have loved reading more of our class book The Last Bear. They have been using their knowledge of the story to help them think and write from April's view point.

<u>Year 5</u> We've had another great week in Year 5, showing and testing our learning powers in lots of different ways! In English we've challenged ourselves by becoming researchers, taking notes from various texts on the Ring of Fire in preparation to write up our non-chronological report. In maths we have deepened our understanding of the relationship between fractions, decimals and percentages, as well as learning how to draw accurate line graphs. We all really enjoyed our first ukulele lesson, listening and joining in so well. Alex (the music teacher) was so impressed and managed to teach the children 3 chords in just the first session! Our French pronunciation is also really coming along, and it was wonderful to see so many children having the confidence to speak in French in front of others. Très bien, année 5!

Year 6 have been really busy this week. In maths we have been perfecting our knowledge of angles. We have learnt about the angles within different types of triangles and quadrilaterals as well as the properties of opposite angles. In English, we have been revising our knowledge of different SPAG features such as conjunctions, relative clauses, different types of sentences and expanded noun phrases. In PE we have been working on our striking and fielding skills in order to be able to play games of cricket. As historians, we have learnt more about the different monarchs of the Tudor period and some of the key events from this time.
