We have been working hard on improving the areas that you suggested. Here are some of the changes we have made in response to the questionnaire:

- Return back to face to face parents/carers evenings rather than on zoom (due to Covid)
- Being informed on upcoming learning through theme webs and homework grids
- Provide a more diverse curriculum this year we have worked hard to improve our curriculum to ensure excellent progression in all subjects
- Inform parents of staffing changes this has been achieved through parentmails, newsletters, early announcements of new teachers for September.
- Providing information to parents on how to teach their children in KS1 we held maths sessions for parents and children to see how we teach the children and learn current methods.

 Informal sessions for parents to learn more about SEN – Mrs Roberts (SENCo) and our Educational Psychologist have held multiple coffee mornings on many areas of school life, and have led a SWIFT course to support families.

We are continuing to focus on the following areas that you suggested for next year: Mindfulness/Yoga, KS2 maths parents sessions, a wider range of after school opportunities for younger children and more music and cooking. We look forward to hearing your thoughts in September, when the next parent questionnaire will take place.

Friday afternoons at Stockham School

Currently, Years 1-6 have Golden Time from 2-2.45pm every Friday. Senior leaders and staff in school have made the decision that from September 2023 Golden Time will take place on the last (full day) Friday of each school term (6 times a year). This way, staff can really make sure the activities are special and can plan for this time appropriately to give the children the best experiences/opportunities. Weekly golden time is not allowing for the full curriculum to be taught and is no longer feeling 'Golden!'
