#### **Class News**

- Year F In Foundation this week we have kicked off our 'Traditional Tales' topic with the story 'Mr Wolf's Pancakes' which introduced lots of the characters we'll be learning about in the coming weeks. We enjoyed writing shopping lists, making pancake batter, discussing balanced and healthy choices for the toppings and tasting some pancakes at school! We have looked at recipes and written our own recipe for perfect pancakes. In maths we have been comparing, talking about who has more and who has fewer, and how we know when the amounts are equal.
- Year 1 This week in Year 1 we have started our new topic about Queens. The children loved finding out some facts about Queen Elizabeth and learning the National Anthem. In English we have been learning about Verbs and using them to give instructions for making a pancake!
- Year 2 In Year 2 we have hit the ground running with our new topic It's a Kind of Magic! We have been reading a dragon poem in our reading sessions called The Pet and in English we have been reading a non-chronological report about a dragon. We will be immersing ourselves in magic this term and are very excited! In maths we are continuing our work on fractions and are securing the terminology of numerator and denominator in all our lessons.

- Year 3 In Year 3 this week we have been sharing our news from the holiday and looking at the different ways that we can use commas in our writing. In maths we have been looking at adding and subtracting 2 and 3 digit numbers, we have been looking at number sentences that need exchanging in both the tens and ones columns. We have also thoroughly enjoyed our adventure themed World Book Day, we have studied the book Skysteppers by Kathryn Rundell and taken part in a nationwide live lesson all about enjoying reading.
- Year 4 Year 4 have had a great start back to Term 4. We have begun to investigate our new text 'The Lion and The Unicorn' and have made some brilliant predictions about what might happen to our main character. We have thought about some key questions we have, based on what we have already seen and heard. We have also started to talk about our new history focus of World War II as part of links to this book and have already shown great sensitivity in our discussions. In maths we have been looking more at multiplication and have tried hard to learn facts for the 7 times table. Please keep asking us lots of quick-fire times table questions at home! We have had great fun during World Book Day and have enjoyed sharing our favourite book characters and books.
- **Year 5** Year 5 have been looking at long multiplication in maths and we have started our new English topic based on the book Kick! We also had great fun on World Book Day.
- **Year 6** This week Year 6 have been busy with assessments. In science we have been exploring the circulatory system. In maths, we have been investigating angles.
