Key Stage 2 lead

It was a really fun day and all the children were full of energy and enthusiasm. As a school, we managed to raise the enormous amount of £2,024.67! This is absolutely incredible and **we want to say a huge thank you to our children for taking part and to all the parents and carers in the local community who supported the children through sponsorship.** This money both supports the charity, who are able to keep running and supporting Olympic and Paralympic athletes to compete at the highest level, and our school where we now have a large amount of money to dedicate to PE equipment in school. Children will soon be celebrating through receiving their sponsorship rewards.





Class News

- Year F** In Foundation this week we have been learning about the Hindu festival of Divali; why it is celebrated and how they celebrate. We have enjoyed making our own Diva lamps, rangoli patterns and designing our own mendhi hand decorations. We found out about the Story of Rama and Sita and retold it through acting it out and sequencing the story. In maths we have been thinking about comparing quantities – knowing when there is more than, or less than another amount.
- Year 1** In Year 1 this week we have been learning about Guy Fawkes and the Gun Powder Plot. The children showed a real interest in finding out about this historical event. In English we have been looking at books by Julia Donaldson and starting to learn the story of Room On a Broom. In the maths the children have been using the greater and less than signs in their busy time, they have really impressed the adults with their comparisons of groups of objects.
- Year 2** In Year 2 we have already got stuck into our new topic Incredible India! We have been listening to and retelling an Indian folk tale in our English lessons. We have used story mapping and story stepping to help us do this. And in our Geography lessons we have been finding out on which continents India and the UK can be found. We have been using maps of the world to support us with this.
- Year 3** In Year 3 we have been starting to look at column addition with digit numbers, we have been using place value counters and place value mats to help with this, this is helping us to get ready to use exchanging. In English we have been learning how to edit and improve our work. In history we have started looking at what prehistoric means, to help us understand this we have been looking at the role of an archaeologist.
- Year 4** Year 4 have had a great start to Term 2. We have already learnt our new story of 'Escape from Pompeii' by story mapping and story stepping it. We have already learnt a little bit about the true events at Pompeii and are looking forward to learning more. In maths we have been learning all about Roman numerals and how to write and read numbers using these different symbols. As scientists, we have begun thinking about our digestive system and drawn what we think happens inside our bodies. As historians we have begun to think about timelines and where different events in history fit on there.
- Year 5** This week we have started looking at multiplication in maths and in English we have been finding the shape of a non-chronological report. We have also started our swimming lessons which were great fun.
- Year 6** This week, Year 6 have begun exploring their new topic 'There is no planet B'. In geography, we have explored what COP26 is. We have also looked at what climate is and the different climates found over the world. In English, we are starting to look at how authors deliver messages to children about the environment. In science, we have explored inherited characteristics. Year 6 have also worked incredibly hard on their assessments this week and all the adults are very proud of their level of determination.
